The desired starting date is April 1, 2023. This is a household position intended for qualification purposes, which is initially limited to 3 years. A prolongation is foreseen.

We expand our working group on commons governance and institutional analysis. We offer the opportunity to work in a national and international research team that is embedded in the International Association for the Study of the Commons and has close ties to the Ostrom Workshop in Bloomington, Indiana University, USA.

Salary:

The salary is according to qualification and tasks up to 13 TV-L.

Tasks:

- Research in the field of governance of local and global commons (such as water, land, biodiversity, climate, food) in relation to agricultural production and current trends in the food and nutrition sector.
- Quantitative and qualitative social research method adaptation to be applied to commons related studies and theory development and to measure societal transformation.
- Support with research projects application and science management.
- Development of an independent research focus within the scope of the subject areas of the department and corresponding third-party funding.
- Participation in teaching BSc and MSc classes (e.g. Land governance) and supervision of students.
- Organizational and administrative tasks of the research group.

Requirements:

- The preferred candidate has a Master of Science (or diploma) in Agricultural Sciences, Sustainability Sciences, Ecological Economics, Institutional Economics, Political Science or related fields.
- PhD with relevance to commons theory and institutional analysis of the management of shared resources and jointly produced resources.
- The candidate is strongly encouraged to pursue further qualifications for an academic career.
- Knowledge of qualitative and quantitative social science methods to be applied to institutional analysis, political analysis, resource economics and behavioral and/or values-based studies of collective action.
- Experience in acquisition of third-party funds and the organizational processing of projects is an asset.
- Experience in international collaborations is an asset
