Creating Knowledge. Since 1502: Martin Luther University Halle-Wittenberg (MLU) offers a wide range of academic subjects in the areas of humanities, social sciences, natural sciences and medicine. The oldest and largest university in Saxony-Anhalt was created in 1817 when the University of Wittenberg (founded in 1502) merged with Friedrichs University Halle (founded in 1694). Today the university has 340 professors and 20,000 students. Research at the university focuses on nano and life sciences, the Enlightenment, society and culture.

Martin-Luther-University Halle-Wittenberg, Center for School and Educational Research, offers within The Research Training Group "Subject Specific Learning and Interaction in Elementary School" (INTERFACH), funded by the German Research Foundation (DFG), three-year positions, starting 01-01-2025, of

Remuneration will be paid up to pay grade E13 TV-L, depending on the tasks assigned and the fulfillment of personal requirements.

Work tasks:

- Development and realization of your own PhD project within the framework of the DFG Research Training Group "Subject Specific Learning and Interaction in Elementary School" (INTERFACH, www.interfach.de). The PhD project should combine interaction analyses with didactic questions in the subjects German and/or mathematics and should be expected to be completed successfully within three years.
- Active participation in the qualification program and in the academic exchange of Research Training Group in the form of seminars, workshops, conferences and colloquia as well as in the realization of study and research stays.
- Participation in the multi-paradigmatic, overarching research discourse within the Graduate School.

Requirements:

- Very good scientific university degree in education, psychology, linguistics or sociology or state exam in teaching.
- Ability to outline a PhD project that fits the thematic framework of the Research Training Group and that can be expected to be successfully completed within three years. Interested parties can apply with their own project ideas or draw on suggestions for possible PhD projects (see www.interfach.de)
- Since the discourse of the Research Training Group is partially conducted in English (at the international summer schools, at international conferences), a good command of English is desirable.
- International applicants can apply in English, but must be willing to learn German, the working language of the Research Training Group, within the first year.

Applications from persons with disabilities will be given preferential consideration, if equally qualified and competent. Women are strongly encouraged to apply. Applicants with a degree that was not obtained at a German university must submit a Statement of Comparability for Foreign Higher Education Qualifications, issued by the Zentralstelle für ausländisches Bildungswesen (Central Office for Foreign Education, <https://www.kmk.org/zab/central-office-for-foreign-education>) as proof of equivalence.

In addition to the curriculum vitae and copies of certificates, the application documents should include a letter of motivation (1 page) and an outline of the PhD project (20,000 to 30,000 characters, plus literature), which locates the planned project with its research question and perspective in the thematic framework of the Research Training Group and contains a rough work plan and timetable. The development of a project idea can be supported by an online application workshop offered by the Research Training Group on August 13, 2024. Interested persons should register by August 9, 2024 at bewerbungsworkshop-interfach@uni-kassel.de. To support the preparation of the required project outline for the application, the Research Training Group will also offer a writing workshop.

The call for applications is subject to potential budgetary restrictions.

Application costs will not be reimbursed by Martin-Luther-University. Application documents will only be returned if a sufficiently stamped envelope is enclosed. An electronic application is welcome.
